Annual Treasurer's Report – David Wick, Treasurer of Tesoro, reviewed the annual financial status and noted the tremendous progress made in stabilizing the association's financial position. The 2023



improvements included \$32,886 of operating income placed into our reserve fund for future improvements; \$46,181 in interest was earned on reserve investments. This figure is significantly increased from the \$7,457 in 2022. A 12% increase in utilities (largest expense) and 9% increase in insurance policies (2nd largest expense) were partially offset by other cost savings, reducing total expense growth to only 6%! Mr. Wick reported the tremendous progress made in stabilizing the association's financial position.
